

**FIRST LEGO League Volunteer Descriptions**  
**Saturday, December 8, 2007 from 7:15 AM to 5 PM**

**Practice Table Monitor 7:15 AM–10:30 AM or 10:30 AM–1 PM or 1-3:30 PM (Need 4 ea)**

Are you able to be firm yet polite and friendly? Then we need you! As a monitor, you will be responsible for ensuring that teams using the practice table stay on time and that the transition of teams runs smoothly. This position directly interacts with the teams and coaches. The tables will be available for use by teams wishing to practice for the Robot Challenge rounds. There will be no loose pieces on the tables; teams must bring their own pieces from their Challenge set.

Time Commitment: 30 minute training session before event, 2.5-3.25 hours day of event **(3-3.75 hours total)**

**Team Work Judging Assistants 8 AM–11:45 AM (Need 4)**

This job keeps you on your feet and moving through the pit area (where the teams are based) and allows you to see how the students interact with each other and the judges. You will be assisting the judges and monitoring the time as they judge the Team Work portion of the tournament. Attend the 8 AM judges morning meeting.

Time Commitment: 30 minute training session before event, 3.75 hours day of event **(4.25 hours total)**

**Monitor/Timekeepers 8 AM–10 AM or 10 AM–Noon (Need 8 ea)**

**Final round shift 12:15 PM–2:15 PM (Need 1)**

Monitor/Timekeepers play a critical role in keeping this tournament running on time! You will be seated outside a judging room and will greet the coaches and teams and remind them to be quiet in the halls as they wait their turn. Monitor/Timekeepers notify the project judges when the team should be done to keep on schedule. You also collect score sheets from judges for the runners (you will take the original and the judge will keep the copy.)

Time Commitment: 30 minute training session before event, 2 hours day of event **(2.5 hours total)**

**Judge room runner 8:30 AM–10:30 AM or 10 AM–Noon (Need 1 ea)**

Do you like to keep moving? Then be a runner, getting the score sheets from the judges in the room to the scorekeepers in the gym picking them up and dropping them off.

Time Commitment: 30 minute training session before event, 2 hours day of event **(2.5 hours total)**

**Bullpen Escorts 11 AM-1:45 PM and 1:30 PM-4 PM (Need 2 ea)**

Are you a take charge individual? If so, you would do well as a Bullpen escort. Volunteers in this role are responsible for escorting the teams to and from their tables in the pit area to the bullpen and keeping the teams together, behind the line, and on time for their performance. Once the two teams have gotten to the challenge tables, you will then go back and escort the next set of teams.

Time Commitment: 30 minute training session before event, 2.5-2.75 hours day of event **(3-3.25 hours total)**

**Challenge Table Runners 11 AM-1:45 PM and 1:30 PM-4 PM (Need 1 ea)**

Volunteers in this role are responsible for collecting the score sheets from the referees. After each challenge, the referees will score the round. Once they have finished, a copy of the score sheet will be given to the team's coach. The originals will need to be collected from all four challenge tables and taken to the scorekeepers.

Time Commitment: 30 minute training session before event, 2.5-2.75 hours day of event **(3-3.25 hours total)**

**Challenge Table/Field Set-up 11 AM-1:30 PM or 1:30-4 PM (Need 4 ea)**

*Do you like to be hands-on? Do you like Legos and Robots?* As a Field Set-up volunteer you play a critical role in keeping the tournament running on time and for the integrity of the challenge mission set-up! You will be standing next to one challenge table and are responsible for making sure the table set-up is complete before each robot challenge. Major Roles:

- After each Robot Challenge, the referees will need to score the round. Make sure you communicate with the referee to ensure they have completed scoring before you begin resetting the table.
- You are responsible for replacing all the Challenge pieces to their original location. It is important to make sure they are placed EXACTLY due to the programming of each team's robot.
- At the tournament, you will have a clipboard containing a picture of the challenge table as it needs to be set and a list of all the pieces and their location.

Time Commitment: 60 minute training session before event, 2.5 hours day of event **(3.5 hours total)**

**Media Assistant 11:30 AM- 2 PM and 1:30 PM- 4 PM (Need 1 ea)**

Assisting College Access film crew as needed, watching the camera, and running errands.

Time Commitment: 30 minute training session before event, 2.5 hours day of event **(3 hours total)**

**Set-up Friday, Dec. 7 at Gates from 10 AM – 1PM (Need 2-4)**

**Saturday, Dec. 8 at Gates Tear Down and Clean-up 4 - 6 PM (Need 2)**

*\*Note: You can choose to volunteer for more than one position or more than one time period if you wish. Volunteers are needed throughout the day at various times. You will be scheduled in positions as needed and given exact times the week before the tournament.*
